

I have frequently said how vital the work of our Sunday School is in passing on the faith to our younger generation. We are so grateful to our faithful team of teachers who are so committed to this work which happens throughout the year. We are always keen to recruit new teachers and helpers and if this is an area of ministry that interests you, please have a word with either the Rector or the Curate as we seek to increase our pool of volunteers. On Tuesday 4th June we hope to hold some training in Safeguarding Trust for our Sunday School teachers and helpers, for all who assist at Messy Church or Toddlers or any of our organisations that work with young people. We have to comply with the requirement to constantly update our training in this important area and our experienced panel will deliver this training. We hope all involved will be able to come to receive this important training.

We look forward to another special Messy Church afternoon on Friday 7th June which is targeted at children from 3-11 years of age. Messy Church runs from 3.30pm-5pm and includes crafts, singing, food and some worship. We send special greetings in our magazine this month to parishioners who have not been so well. We know many people have experienced challenges in recent weeks and months and that the magazine and online services have been important resources for people to stay connected. Please be assured you are not forgotten and are often prayed for at our Wednesday communion service and parish prayers over Zoom on Thursday evenings. We also take this opportunity to wish all our younger parishioners well who are sitting important exams in schools and universities. It can be a stressful time for those involved – students, parents and teachers and you are much in our thoughts as this magazine goes to print. With very best wishes.



DATE FOR YOUR DIARY - SOUP LUNCH




Back by popular demand...... a soup lunch is being planned for 15th September after the 11am service.

Hello everyone

Here we are again near the end of another school year. The pupils are finishing exams and along with their teachers are looking forward to the summer holidays. We ended this part of our Mothers' Union session with a visit from Jenny Smyth of CMSI who spoke movingly about the faith, dedication and hard work of the women including Mothers' Union and indeed whole communities amid challenging circumstances in the DRC (Democratic Republic of Congo) and South Sudan. Jenny told us that as rebel forces torched their homes, people who fled with only the clothes on their back settled in to refugee camps. One of the first things the Mothers' Union women did was pool the meagre food supplies, made meals (and before feeding themselves and their families) visited the nearby prison and fed prisoners, some of whom were likely to have been the very rebels who destroyed their homes. What kind of love is that? it is inspired by the love of Jesus who told his followers to love their enemies just as he did on the cross. Mothers' Union Branches are flourishing in these countries in Africa and wear their blue and white uniforms with pride. On a much smaller scale, though still important, our Mothers' Union Branch is going to Coleman's Garden Centre for our annual outing on Saturday 1st June at 2pm.* We will have Afternoon Tea together, share conversations and enjoy each other's company. Liz and I and the rest of the Committee hope you have a lovely summer and we will resume our Branch Meetings in the autumn on Thursday 3rd October at 7:30pm - more details in the July/August magazine.





St. Finnian's Pilates



Hello everyone

Welcome to the June Pilates article which follows on from my discourse in May on the different postural types, focussing on the 'ideal' posture and the many factors that may have an effect on the shape of the spine. This month I'd like to focus on the first posture type I mentioned last month i.e. Kyphosis-Lordosis. This type is very common and is an exaggerated curve of both the thoracic and lumbar spine, with the head typically thrust forward and the chin jutting out and with the pelvis tilted forwards causing the lower spine to be overly hollowed. If you could see the spine from the side it would look like a much rounder 's' shape as opposed to the gentle curvature of the ideal posture. Most of the joints are held out of the natural neutral positions because of muscle imbalances such as shortened tight muscles, weak lengthened muscles, inefficient stabilizers and overactive mobilizers. These imbalances in turn can lead to faulty recruitment patterns that, when continually repeated, begin to feel like normal movement and the nervous system accepts them as natural. In particular the muscles of the lower back are shortened, the abdominals are very weak, the hamstrings are usually tight and knees are hyperextended. Thankfully the exercises designed by Joseph Pilates can be used to restore optimal recruitment of the muscle groups through repetition of good movement patterns and strengthening and lengthening muscles appropriately. Unfortunately there are no short cuts and the process will be a gradual one as you build strength and stability and increase your sense of body awareness through the various exercises. There are a number of exercises recommended for this postural type including the pelvic compass and shoulder bridge, the dart, oblique curl ups, the dumb waiter and knee drops. However, as most of these are included in routine exercise programmes, the regular classes should provide a good starting point for addressing postural issues and poor alignment and I would encourage anyone to get involved if they want to improve this aspect of their health. I'll carry on with more discussion of other postural issues next month but in the meantime, stay safe and keep moving. We meet on Wednesdays at 7pm in the Huston Hall. Everyone is very welcome and a small donation of £3 per class is requested to go towards church funds.
